

# Sadie and Corey

### In Their Own Words

**1.** How old were you when you became a mother for the first time? I was 19 years old.

**2.** How did you feel? I was terrified and unsure as to what to expect. It wasn't something that was planned.

**3. What challenges have you faced?** Trying to balance school and raise a child. I felt like I had to prove myself to everyone. I felt like I was looked

down upon for being a young parent, which had nothing to do with my ability to parent and everything to do with my age.

- **4. How has your life changed?** My confidence as a parent has increased. By attending programs and groups at the Rose of Durham, I didn't feel alone. I saw other moms like myself. I was able to create a support network and build lasting friendships.
- **5.** What programs at Rose of Durham did you attend and why? I first came looking for a school program to complete my grade 12 English. I also needed support for myself, as my only supports (my parents) were two hours away and my partner's parents were not supportive of the pregnancy. The Rose was always great at offering me individual support and group support. My husband and I, who were broken up at the time, took the Partner's In Parenting group. That group taught us how to communicate, how to put our son first, and how to recognize the other person's position, so much so that we got back together, got married and had another child.
- **6. How did these programs help in your role as a parent?** These programs changed my perception on things in a big way. My partner and I were able to parent from the perspective of what works best for the child. We built a greater understanding of why kids behave the way they do and as a result built our own patience. Our relationship survived because of the support that was offered to myself and my partner.
- **7. How did your involvement with the Rose of Durham help you as an individual?** The emotional and mental support by the counsellors helped motivate me through difficult times. I was able to adapt well to changes with their support.
- **8. In your view, what is your greatest success?** Completing not only high-school, but also post-secondary is my greatest success. Now I can have a career.
- 9. Did Rose of Durham contribute to your success? YES!

We are lucky to have someone like Catherine on our staff, as one of our colleagues, and most importantly the community we serve is lucky to have her.


















# Holiday Hope Hampers 2016!
