Today, the significant impact Rose of Durham has had within its area of organization in Durham Region when it comes to caring for the mental health of infants.

To recognize the advancements made over the past eight years, Rose of Durham was awarded a four year accreditation by the Canadian Centre for Accreditation (CCA) in recognition of achieving established CCA standards for quality in governance, management, and child and youth mental health services.

Rose of Durham is proud to be accredited by the Canadian Centre for Accreditation which offers a third-party review process that is tailored to community-based organizations. CCA accreditation is based on widely accepted best practice standards that promote ongoing quality improvement and responsive, effective community service.

In August 2018 Rose of Durham was granted a four year accreditation in recognition of our continuous improvement efforts. CCA accreditation supports excellence and quality in our provision of community-based programs and services.

Who knew giving back could be so much fun?




